One of the reasons *Writings on the Wall* was selected for Reading Together is because the author provides concrete suggestions—see below—that are perfect springboards for continued discussion in book groups and throughout the community. (This also makes the book ideal for more in-depth conversations about just one or two chapters, depending on the specific interests of each group.) For starters, we encourage you to ponder the following questions, and then see where the conversation goes!

- Do you agree with the suggestions?
- How do (or don't) they apply to Kalamazoo? What are some specific examples?
- What are some actions we can take in our community to affect change?

Chapter 1 - American Politics: The Broom of the System

1. Teach the children well.
2. Stop encouraging people who don't want to vote to vote.
3. Fact-check politicians as often as possible when they speak publicly.

Chapter 2 – Racism: Make We Wanna Holler

1. Teach public awareness.
2. Apply social pressure.
3. Pass and enforce anti-racist laws; block enactment of racist laws.
4. Peacefully protest every racist action.
5. Support affirmative action.
6. Press for more minorities in TV and movies.

Chapter 3 – Religion: Worship at Your Own Risk

1. Make and enforce strict hate-crime laws.
2. Speak up.
3. Create more interfaith activities.

1. Convince people of the causes of inequality.
