Behind the scenes at the Friends Bookstore

This summer the Friends Bookstore has received an abundance of book donations from the Kalamazoo community. Do you ever wonder what happens to those donations? If so, here's a peek behind the scenes.

Browsing through the store, you'll find a well-ordered space with books, CDs, and DVDs shelved in categories. However, when those materials arrive in the garage on donation days, our volunteers begin organizing the chaos. Items are taken from the bins, then placed on carts sorted by fiction, nonfiction, children's, and audiovisual.









Books received during the previous week are moved downstairs, into the store where Monday morning sorters evaluate their condition. "Like New" books are moved into the Gift Books Collection, and more valuable books are considered for listing online. Fiction books are separated further into Mystery and General Fiction, then stored into the backroom, ready to be shelved, when space becomes available. Non-fiction is separated into various categories, organized in the backroom, then ready for the storefront.

On Tuesdays, volunteers Janice and Linda create spotlight carts and patio specials, then price and restock our shelves. Our hardworking and dedicated volunteers are essential in how the Friends Bookstore operations run smoothly every week. They take on these tasks behind the scenes to ensure the bookstore will be ready for customers when the store opens on Wednesdays at noon.

Honoring the Foundation of Kalamazoo During Black History Month

February is Black History Month, and KPL is honoring some of the formative Black men and women who have impacted the founding and growth of Kalamazoo. Enoch and Deborah Harris: Kalamazoo County Black Pioneers

Among the earliest pioneers in Oshtemo Township were Enoch Harris and his family, the first Black settlers in Kalamazoo County. They arrived in Michigan from Marion County, Ohio, in approximately 1830, bringing with them seed from which they are said to have planted the first apple orchard in Kalamazoo County. Harris was sufficiently respected by his neighbors that he was often asked to mediate property disputes. The Harris family also owns the distinction of celebrating the first wedding in Oshtemo Township, when daughter Louisa Harris married Henry Powers in 1836.

Enoch Harris was born in Virginia in 1785 and raised in Pennsylvania, where he married his wife Deborah, in 1812. She was in born in 1793. They had settled more than once on the Ohio frontier before coming to Michigan.

Enoch Harris died on March 21, 1870, at the age of 85. Deborah died on May 2, 1881. Both are buried in Genesee Prairie Cemetery, located at the corner of Parkview Avenue and 11th Street, where a historical marker was dedicated in their honor in 1973. They left many descendants, some of whom still live in Kalamazoo County.






