Care Collective is looking for a **Program Manager** to join our small-but-mighty team. The Program Manager will manage diaper and period product supply at our warehouse, which includes maintaining inventory, storage/organization, and coordinating the delivery of products to partner organizations.

The Program Manager will have opportunities to create and imagine new ways of accomplishing our vision of a community where everyone can access basic essentials.

Program Manager Responsibilities:

Coordinate inventory and logistics for distribution of diapers and period supplies

- Manage inventory spreadsheets and check for errors
- Use projections to execute an ordering plan for the year
- Schedule and receive bulk order deliveries, move pallets of products using a pallet jack
- Communicate with Outreach Manager about product quantities and delivery schedule for volunteer repackaging

Oversee product delivery to community partners

- Schedule deliveries to partner organizations and maintain the delivery calendar
- Load and deliver products to partner organizations in Care Collective's van (move products weighing up to 50 lbs)
- Assign deliveries to Operations Coordinator
- Build relationships with community partners to ensure effective communication about scheduling and changing product needs

Develop organization and maintenance of product storage space

- Maintain product storage and layout at the warehouse
- Assess accessibility of space for visitors and volunteer groups

- Demonstrated commitment to and understanding of anti-racism and equity
- Lived experience and/or deep understanding of challenges faced by low-income families, including diaper need and period poverty
